

## Verb review 1: regular (non-deponents)

ambulō (1) walk

dēleō (2) dēlēuī I destroy

accipiō 3/4 accēpi I receive, welcome, learn, obtain

ueniō 4 uēni I come, arrive

*Translate into Latin. You needn't mark long vowels save where essential. I do one as an example.*

1. She has walked *ambulauit*
2. I do receive *accipio*
3. They came *uēnimus* (the long vowel essential: otherwise present indicative)
4. They will come *uenient*
5. I did receive *accepi*
6. They will walk *ambulabunt*
7. She has destroyed *deleuit*
8. I have arrived *uēni* (long vowel essential: otherwise imperative)
9. Y'all will destroy *delebitis*
10. Destroy! (plural) *delete!*
11. I will arrive *ueniam*
12. She will obtain *accipiet*
13. We do destroy *delemus*
14. They are coming *uenimus*
15. Walk! (singular) *ambula!*

*Give a synopsis of each verb in the 3<sup>rd</sup> person plural (present, future, perfect)*
